CHAPTER 462

RADIOGRAPHERS AND LIMITED X-RAY MACHINE OPERATORS

462.01 Definitions.
 462.02 Practice, use of title restricted.
 462.03 Issuance of license, permit.
 462.04 Prescription or order required.

462.05 Renewal of license, permit.
 462.06 Rule making.
 462.07 Discipline.

Cross Reference: See also RAD, Wis. adm. code.

462.01 Definitions. In this chapter:

- (1) "Board" means the radiography examining board.
- (2) "Bone densitometry" means the quantitative assessment of bone mass using single or dual energy X-ray absorptiometry.
- (3) "Department" means the department of safety and professional services.
- (4) "Physician" means a person licensed to practice medicine and surgery under s. 448.04 (1) (a) or (b).
- (5) "Practice of radiography" means the imaging of anatomical structures, produced by the combined application of X-rays to the human body and the application of knowledge in the fields of anatomy, radiographic positioning, and radiographic technique, and knowledge of principles of radiation protection, for the purpose of medical diagnosis except that "practice of radiography" does not include bone densitometry.

462.02 Practice, use of title restricted. (1) (a) Subject to sub. (2), no person may use the title "radiographer," represent himself or herself as a radiographer, or engage in the practice of radiography, unless the person is granted a license under s. 462.03 (2).

(b) A person who holds a limited X-ray machine operator permit to perform radiography and who does not hold a license under s. 462.03 (2) may not perform radiography except as authorized under the permit. A limited X-ray machine operator permit shall authorize the holder to perform radiography of one or more of the following:

1. The thorax, lungs, and ribs.
2. The upper and lower extremities, including the pectoral girdle but excluding the hip and pelvis.
3. The foot, ankle, and lower leg below the knee.
4. The cervical, thoracic, and lumbar spine.

(2) Subsection (1) does not apply to any of the following:

- (a) A physician.
- (b) A person enrolled as a student in a radiography program approved by the board, if the person is directly supervised by a physician or a person licensed under s. 462.03 (2).
- (c) A chiropractor licensed under s. 446.02 or a person under the direct supervision of such a chiropractor, if the person has successfully completed a course of instruction comprising at least 48 hours of instruction approved by the chiropractic examining board related to X-ray examinations.
- (d) A dentist licensed under s. 447.04 (1), a dental hygienist licensed under s. 447.04 (2), or a person under the direct supervision of a dentist.
- (e) A physician assistant licensed under s. 448.04 (1) (f).
- (f) A podiatrist licensed under s. 448.63 or a person under the direct supervision of such a podiatrist, if the person has successfully completed a course of instruction approved by the podiatrists affiliated credentialing board related to X-ray examinations under s. 448.695 (3).

462.03 Issuance of license, permit. (1) GENERAL REQUIREMENTS. The board may not grant a license or limited X-ray machine operator permit under this section to a person unless all of the following apply:

- (a) The person is at least 18 years of age.
- (b) The person holds a high school diploma or its equivalent, as determined by the board.
- (c) The person pays the initial credential fee determined by the department under s. 440.03 (9) (a).
- (d) The person submits an application on a form provided by the department.
- (e) Subject to ss. 111.321, 111.322, and 111.335, the person does not have an arrest or conviction record.

(2) LICENSE. Subject to sub. (1), the board shall grant a license to practice radiography to a person who passes an examination administered by the board and submits evidence satisfactory to the board that the person has completed a course of study in radiography that has been approved by the board or an equivalent course of study, as determined by the board.

(3) PERMIT. Subject to sub. (1), the board shall grant a limited X-ray machine operator permit to perform radiography to a person who passes an examination administered by the board and submits evidence satisfactory to the board that the person has completed an appropriate course of study, as determined by the board.

462.04 Prescription or order required. A person who holds a license or limited X-ray machine operator permit under this chapter may not use diagnostic X-ray equipment on humans for diagnostic purposes unless authorized to do so by prescription or order of a physician licensed under s. 448.04 (1) (a), a dentist licensed under s. 447.04 (1), a podiatrist licensed under s. 448.63, a chiropractor licensed under s. 446.02, an advanced practice nurse certified under s. 441.16 (2), or a physician assistant licensed under s. 448.04 (1) (f).


462.05 Renewal of license, permit. (1) The renewal date for licenses and limited X-ray machine operator permits granted under this chapter is specified in s. 440.08 (2) (a). Renewal applications shall be submitted to the department on a form provided by the department and shall include the renewal fee determined by the department under s. 440.03 (9) (a).

(2) (a) A radiographer or limited X-ray machine operator is not eligible for renewal of a license or permit under sub. (1) unless the radiographer or limited X-ray machine operator has complied with the continuing education requirements established by the board under s. 462.06 (1) (c).

(b) Paragraph (a) does not apply to a radiographer or limited X-ray machine operator if the radiographer or limited X-ray machine operator is applying for renewal for the first time.

AN ACT to renumber 45.40 (1); to amend 15.085 (1m) (b), 15.406 (3) (intro.), 25.36 (1), 29.193 (2) (b) 2., 29.193 (2) (c) 3., 29.193 (2) (e), 45.40 (2m) (a), 45.40 (2m) (b), 45.40 (3m), 49.45 (9), 49.855 (4m) (b), 50.36 (3) (b), 50.36 (3) (c), 50.39 (3), 146.37 (1g), 180.1901 (1m) (bk), 185.981 (1), 185.981 (2), 185.981 (3), 185.981 (4), 185.982 (1), 343.62 (4) (a) 4., subchapter IV (title) of chapter 448 [precedes 448.60], 448.60 (1), 450.11 (8) (bm), 632.64, 632.99, 655.45 (1), 812.30 (9), 814.29 (1) (d) 1., 895.48 (1m) (a) (intro.) and 2., 905.04 (title), 905.04 (1) (b), 905.04 (1) (c), 905.04 (2) and 905.04 (3); and to create 45.40 (1g), 45.40 (1t) and 905.04 (1) (dg) of the statutes; relating to: podiatrist-patient privilege, immunity exemption for podiatrists providing emergency care at athletic events, allowing podiatrists to determine an illness or injury and complete forms for the purpose of granting assistance to needy veterans, allowing podiatrists to determine disability for the purpose of issuing certain hunting permits, cooperatives organized to provide sickness care, the Podiatrists Affiliated Credentialing Board, allowing podiatrists to certify driver school instructors' physical fitness, allowing Medical Assistance recipients to freely choose among podiatrists, and giving equal weight to certifications of disability by podiatrists for insurance purposes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 15.085 (1m) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:

15.085 (1m) (b) The public members of the physical therapists affiliated credentialing board, podiatrists podiatry affiliated credentialing board or occupational therapists affiliated credentialing board shall not be engaged in any profession or occupation concerned with the delivery of physical or mental health care.

SECTION 2. 15.406 (3) (intro.) of the statutes is amended to read:

15.406 (3) (intro.) PODIATRISTS PODIATRY AFFILIATED CREDENTIALING BOARD. There is created in the department of regulation and licensing, attached to the medical examining board, a podiatrists podiatry affiliated creden-

tialing board consisting of the following members appointed for 4-year terms:

SECTION 3. 25.36 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

25.36 (1) Except as provided in sub. (2), all moneys appropriated or transferred by law shall constitute the veterans trust fund which shall be used for the lending of money to the mortgage loan repayment fund under s. 45.37 (5) (a) 12. and for the veterans programs under ss. 20.485 (2) (m), (mn), (tm), (u), (v), (vo), (vy), (w), (z), and (zm), 45.03 (19), 45.07, 45.20, 45.21, 45.40 (1) (1m), 45.41, 45.42, 45.43, and 45.82 and administered by the department of veterans affairs, including all moneys received from the federal government for the benefit of veterans or their dependents; all moneys paid as interest on and repayment of loans under the post-war rehabilitation fund; soldiers rehabilitation fund, veterans housing

STATUTORY AUTHORITY

Sections 15.08 (5) (b), 227.11 (2) and 448.695, Stats.

POLICY ISSUES

Objective of the Rule:

The current rule on temporary educational licenses states that a temporary educational license is only valid for one year. In order to be a licensed podiatrist, one must have completed two years of postgraduate training. This two-year requirement means that an individual must reapply for a temporary educational license half-way through postgraduate training. The current rule on continuing education states that all licensees seeking to renew their license must complete 50 hours of continuing education within two calendar years of the specified renewal date. This presents a problem for new licensees who received their license towards the end of a renewal period as they must also comply with the requisite 50 hours.

Existing Policies Relevant to the Rules, New Policies Proposed and Analysis of Policy Alternatives. None.

ENTITIES AFFECTED BY THE RULE

Individuals seeking a temporary educational license and new licensees seeking their first renewal.

EXISTING OR PROPOSED FEDERAL LEGISLATION. None.

STAFF TIME REQUIRED

It is estimated that 150 hours will be needed to promulgate the rule.
